Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships curriculum teaches positive relationship skills to students in primary and secondary schools. Promoting social and emotional skills and positive gender norms directly impacts students' physical and mental health, student-teacher relationships and classroom behaviour. It also reduces antisocial behaviours including engagement in gender-related violence.

Taking a whole-school approach is about embedding a culture of respect and gender equality throughout the entire school community. In Term 3, students in all classrooms across Axedale Primary School will be focussing on 'Stress Management' and 'Help-Seeking'. Below is a brief summary of each topic.

TOPIC 5: STRESS MANAGEMENT

Students consider the causes of stress and develop a range of self-regulation and coping strategies they can draw on to manage stressful situations. Activities within this topic area will assist students to:

- · recognise and identify their own emotions
- · describe situations that may evoke strong emotions
- recognise and identify how their emotions can influence the way they feel and act
- · develop self-regulation strategies

TOPIC 6: HELP-SEEKING

Students develop skills and knowledge for peer support, peer referral and help-seeking. Activities within this topic area will assist students to:

- · identify situations that feel safe and unsafe
- identity when they may need to seek help and who they could approach for help
- discuss the importance of seeking help when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone
- · practise seeking help from adults and peers.

FROM THE CLASSROOMS - MUSIC

Music at Axedale Primary - Term 3, 2025

Grade Prep

My what a talented group of prep children we have at Axedale Primary School! There is clear evidence that quite a few of these preps could be future rock stars given their impressive talent on a range of different instruments.

Aside from improving their drum skills through our "carpet drumming" exercises, they've also started learning a number of chords on the ukuleles! They are the first preps in my 18 years as a music teacher that I have been confident enough to run ukulele activities, and they have not disappointed me! We have learnt the C and Am7 chords, played a number of songs using these chords, and even tested our skill using Yousician!

The preps have also worked on their amazing dance skills, used a wide range of percussion instruments and next term will hopefully begin using the boomwhackers, glocks and keyboards!

Genre Wars has continued to provide some interesting debates about what music sounds good, what music is weird, what it makes us feel like and why it has us up and dancing! We've listened to almost 30 different genres of music in grades 1-6, ranging from the ever so popular Country/Country Rock, to techno, heavy metal, Ska, House, Jazz, UK Drill, Rap, K-Pop, Reggatone, Prog Rock and many, many others! Mr Marsh's mystery took out the championship in round 1 with Aussie Roots (John Butler's "Ocean") being the winning Genre.

Grade 1-2s

The grade 1-2 children have continued to work on their drumming skills through carpet drumming with the focus on more complex drum rhythms including learning how to perform a basic rock beat. The co-ordination of the 1-2 children is quite impressive, and their enthusiasm for these sessions is HIGH!

They have also tackled the ukulele, learning C, F, Am7 and also beginning to play more difficult chords like G and Em. Maybe a ukulele ensemble might appear at an assembly one day soon???

Grade 2-3s

The grade 2-3 students have really stepped up this term and as a grade improved in all areas of music. They have begun the instrument program with groups rotating amongst 6 different instruments and 1 song recording activity. They are learning the basics of guitar, ukulele, bass, keyboard, drums, vocals and learning to construct a song on Garage Band. It's been an impressive step up that they have handled with enthusiasm and skill!

Grade 3-4 & 5-6

The two senior grades have continued with the instrument program with many children taking on the extra challenge of using the Martian Maze Music Movement lessons. These lessons get more complex as you tackle the higher star rating videos, which often work on melody or more difficult rhythmic skills.

Next term will see them form small "rock bands" to put all their learnt skills of the year into a mini rock n roll project! It's also a great opportunity to hunt for the next crop of school band members!




