

SCHOOL CROSSING MC IVOR HIGHWAY

We have had concerns raised about some students and the use of the school crossing on McIvor Highway. Students are reminded that they must wait for the crossing supervisor to indicate it is safe to cross. Students on bikes are required to dismount and walk across the crossing when the supervisor indicates it is safe to do so. This ensures the safety of all crossing users and allows vehicle drivers enough time to respond to the crossing supervisor.


